# Children move us!

#### WHO ARE WE?

An SPZ is an out-patient facility where children and adolescents with challenging behaviour, developmental delays, disabilities, and neurological conditions are treated. We work in a multi-professional team comprising:

- Paediatricians and paediatric neurologists
- Psychologists
- Occupational therapists, physio therapists
- Speech therapists
- Healing and social pedagogues
- EEC assistant

#### THE SPZ TEAM



#### WHO DO WE TREAT?

We treat children and adolescents aged 0 to 18. In particular, we examine children if

- a child develops differently from other children
- a child shows speech irregularities
- a child develops more slowly or differently in terms of motor skills
- you suspect that your child's mental development is impaired
- a child has ongoing difficulties at school
- a follow-up examination for a high-risk neonate or premature baby is needed
- a child has a neurological disorder, e.g. a movement disorder
- a child has epileptic seizures
- a child shows behavioural problems that suggest autism or ADHD
- a genetic syndrome is present or suspected in a child

#### **SPECIAL FOCUS AREAS**

- Follow-up care for premature babies
- Continence disorder
- Down's syndrome
- EEC and epilepsy
- Autism

#### THE EXAMINATION

#### For the scheduled appointment, we need:

- a referral slip (not for persons with private insurance)
- the health insurance card
- the yellow check-up booklet
- important previous findings
- photos of your child if you like

We often need more than a single appointment to actually meet your child's needs. We will schedule such further appointments with you on site.

Please note that we cannot examine your child if they are being treated in a different SPZ or a practice for paediatric and adolescent psychiatry in the same quarter.

Following detailed diagnostics, we will develop a treatment plan with you. We will be available for regular further support.

We want to ensure that your child is receiving adequate support and treatment to find their place in society.
